



The Dashing White Sergeant As danced with Da Hooley ceilidh band

The Dashing White Sergeant is a dance for 2 sets of 3 people. Each set of 3 faces another set of 3, making circles of 6 around the edge of the room.

Bars 1-8: Hold hands in your circle. Circle left for 8 and back to the right for 8

Bars 9-12: Dancing in your threes (ignore the other 3!), the person in the middle turns to the person on their right, sets once, and turns them with their right hand

Bars 13-16: The person in the middle turns to the person on their left, sets once, and turns them with their right hand

Bars 17-24: The middle person swings each of the two outside people in turn

Bars 25-28: Take hands in your line of 3 and face the other 3. Walk forward for 2 and *stamp stamp stamp*. Walk backwards for 2 and *clap clap clap*

Bars 29-32: In each circle, one set of 3 joins hands and holds their arms up to form arches. The two sets of 3 walk towards each other, and the 2nd set passes under and through the arches. Each set of 3 keeps walking until they meet a new set of 3 coming towards them.

Hold hands and make a new circle of 6 with the new three, ready to start the dance again
